- A region will provide sustainable use of bioenergy and economic success by strategic management planning and cooperation with stakeholders.

Strategy development and implementation in demo regions


- Seven demo regions
- Practical support for implementation of regional strategic management plans
 - Awareness raising and involvement of local stakeholders
 - Mobilization of unused biomass potential
 - Training of stakeholders and decision makers
 - Adopting of new strategies
- Documentation of implementation activities for a "Lessons learned"catalogue - to be distributed to other interested regions and municipalities across the BSR.
- Workshops und information events, also in further regions, informing on the "Bioenergy Promotion"-concept to use sustainable produced bioenergy
