Introduction

The learning event is organised within the framework of the H2020 project RoundBaltic and its overarching objective of supporting the implementation of the Smart Finance for Smart Buildings initiative in the Baltic Sea Region, notably the project's direct target countries Poland, Latvia and Denmark.

Scope
